## NAME AND OBJECT OF THE FRATERNITY

Delta Sigma is a fraternity organized to encourage scholarship; to further the association of students in the School of Business for their mutual benefit and advancement; to bring about a closer relationship between students of business and the faculty; and to further the interests of the School of Business by contact with the commercial world.

## HISTORY OF DELTA SIGMA.

The organization of Delta Sigma this year was the direct result of the feeling among faculty members and students of the School of Business that the school had grown until it was large enough to ably support another honorary professional fraternity.

In a conference held on May 9, 1929, between Dr. A. B. Adams, Dean of the School of Business, and fifteen of the highest ranking members of the junior class, a discussion was held as to the advisability of organizing an honorary professional fraternity within the School of Business. As a result of the unanimous opinion favoring such action, a temporary organization was formed at that time.

At a meeting held the following night the work and purposes of Delta Sigma Pi were explained to the men present by Dean Adams, who only a short time before had been visited by Mr. H. G. Wright, Grand Secretary of Delta Sigma Pi. After a lengthy discussion of the proposition it was unanimously voted to petition Delta Sigma Pi for a charter.

The permanent organization of the fraternity

was effected at a later meeting when permanent officers were elected, a constitution and by-laws adopted, and a committee appointed to draw up the petition to present to Delta Sigma Pi. Due to the fact that some of the original group selected for membership were not planning to return to school the following year, it was decided, in order to complete an organization of twenty men who ranked high in the school, to admit outstanding members of the sophomore class.

At the final meeting of the year held just before school was out for the summer vacation, every member was present and all were enthusiastic about the work of the fraternity and the prospects for next year.

HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS  
OF  
THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA.

The School of Business was first established as a subordinate school in the College of Arts and Sciences in 1913 under the name of the School of Commerce and Industry. In 1917 the name was changed to the School of Public and Private Business. In June, 1923, the board of regents changed the name to the School of Business and established it as a separate two-year school of the university, authorized to confer the degree of bachelor of science in business on those students who satisfactorily complete the requirements for graduation, which in general consist of two years work in the College of Arts and Science of not less than sixty-four hours, and of two years work in the School of Business of not less than sixty hours.

By action of the board of regents in June, 1926, the following departments of the School of Business were created: Department of economics, department of finance, department of business administration, department of accounting, department of business law, and the department of secretarial sciences. In June, 1927, the board of regents authorized the organization of the bureau of busi-

ness research by the School of Business.

Since its organization as a separate school, the School of Business has shown a rapid and consistent growth. This growth is brought out clearly by the following figures for the five years since its organization as a separate school, under the able direction of Dean A. B. Adams.

The school was organized for the purpose of meeting the needs of the prospective business men in the same way that schools of engineering, law, medicine, and theology have been organized to meet the professional needs of prospective engineers, lawyers, physicians, and ministers. Business knowledge and experience have become so systematized in most branches that they can be taught in classrooms.

The aim of the school is not that of the commercial business college. While the School of Business offers some work which has to do with the mechanical routine of

the business office, the courses offered are designed to give a broader and deeper training than is offered by the commercial business college. Its chief aim is to train students as future business administrators.

At the present time the School of Business does not have its own building but plans are under way to have one in a couple of years. A picture of the entrance to the Administration Building, in which the School of Business is located, is shown on the following page.

HISTORY  
OF  
THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

The University of Oklahoma is founded upon the authority of an act of the legislature of the Territory of Oklahoma, approved December 19, 1890, entitled, "An act to locate and establish the University of Oklahoma." The act provided that when ten thousand dollars and forty acres of land should be given to the territory by the city of Norman the school should be located at that place. These requirements were met, the University of Oklahoma was established at Norman, and students were accepted for the first time in the fall of 1892. In the spring of 1893 work was begun on the first building, which was occupied the following September.

The governing body of the institution from its establishment to December 21, 1907, was a separate Board of Regents, consisting of the Governor, ex officio, and five members appointed by him. The first state Legislature increased the number of appointive members to nine. The Legislature of 1911 vested the government of the institution in the newly created State Board of Education, consisting of the Superintendent of Public Instruction and six members appointed by the Governor. The Legislature of 1919 passed a bill vesting the government of the uni-

versity again in a separate Board of Regents, consisting of seven members, including at least two alumni of the university. The regents appointed under this act assumed their duties April 9, 1919. The Legislature of 1927 modified the law creating the Board of Regents by providing that members can be removed only by impeachment proceedings and by requiring that at least three members be alumni of the university. Members of the new board created by this act were appointed by the Governor on March 24, 1927.

Since the establishment of the university it has been served by six men as president or acting president. David Ross Boyd was president from 1892 to 1908. Arthur Grant Evans was president from 1908 to 1911. Julien C. Monnet was acting president during the school year 1911-12. Stratton Duluth Brooks was president from 1912 to 1923. James Shannon Buchanan was acting president in 1923-24, and president in 1924-25. William Bennett Bizzell became president July 1, 1925, and is still serving in that capacity.

The University of Oklahoma now comprises nine colleges and separate schools. Each of these is governed

by a dean and faculty. The general faculty consists of the president, the vice-president, the deans, the assistant deans, the heads of all departments, all instructors, professors, assistant professors, as well as the assistant to the president, the registrar, the librarian, and the superintendent of university public utilities. The administrative council consists of the president, the vice-presidents, the deans, and the registrar.

The university occupies a campus of one hundred and seventy-five acres situated in the southern part of the city of Norman. This tract includes, besides an original forty acres given by the people of Norman in 1892, sixty acres lying contiguous to the original campus, obtained in 1914, in exchange for a section of land granted to the university by Congress in 1907, forty-seven acres, lying south of the older part of the campus, purchased in 1925, and eight acres, lying east of Jenkins Avenue, the former eastern boundary of the campus, purchased in 1928. By the exchange of land in 1914 the university also secured a president's house and several lots adjacent to the campus.

The principal buildings are located on the northern part of the campus. Seven of them face upon what is known as the "Oval" at the north entrance of which are



Gothic gateways, memorials of the classes of 1915 and 1917. Facing the other avenue leading to the campus are similar gateways, memorials of the classes of 1919 and 1920.

The first university building, completed in 1893, was destroyed by fire in January, 1903. Old University Hall, completed in March, 1903, was destroyed by fire in December, 1907. Science Hall and the Carnegie Library, now the Education Building, were erected in 1904. The later buildings are planned in accordance with a systematic scheme for landscape and design. The last addition to the campus will be ready for use in September, 1929, when the new library building will be opened. The completion of this building gives the university a total of twenty-three buildings located on the campus at Norman besides the five buildings comprising the medical school at Oklahoma City.

## CONSTITUTION OF DELTA SIGMA.

### Preamble.

A fraternity organized to encourage scholarship; to further the association of students in the School of Business for their mutual benefit and advancement; and to bring about a closer relationship between the commercial world and students of business.

### Article 1.

This fraternity shall be known as Delta Sigma.

### Article 11.

Section 1. The officers of this fraternity shall be; President, vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Director of Social Activities.

Section 2. All officers shall be elected by secret ballot, a majority of the votes cast constituting a choice.

Section 3. The duties of these officers shall be such as commonly appertain to their offices.

Section 4. The term of office for all officers shall be one semester.

Section 5. In case of a vacancy in one of the offices, a succeeding member shall be elected to fill the unexpired term.

### Article III.

#### Admission of Members.

Section 1. Any male student in the School of Business, of Christian faith and the Caucasian race, who ranks among the upper twenty-five (25) percent of his class in scholastic average and who does not have lower than a B- average or its equivalent, shall be eligible for membership.

Section 2. No person shall be received into this fraternity except by unanimous vote of all the active members present at the time of the election.

Section 3. No member of any other commerce fraternity shall be eligible for membership in this fraternity.

Section 4. The name of any prospective candidate for membership shall be presented to the fraternity one week before he shall be voted upon.

#### Article IV

##### Quorum.

Section 1. A majority of all the active members shall constitute a quorum to do business and in no case shall the fraternity be opened for business in the absence of a quorum.

Section 2. Two-thirds of the active members shall constitute a quorum for the election of officers or for the consideration of any matter relative to the amending the constitution.

#### Article V.

##### Committees.

Section 1. The president shall have the power to appoint all necessary committees.

#### Article VI.

##### Amendments.

Section 1. The constitution may be altered or amended

by a three-fourths (3/4) vote of the house  
as provided in Article IV, Section 2.

Section 2. All amendments must be proposed in writing,  
signed by two members, and remain on the  
table for one week before action can be  
taken on the same.

#### Article VII.

This constitution shall be in force from and  
after its adoption.

BY-LAWS OF DELTA SIGMA.

Article I.

Order of Business.

- Section 1. a. Roll call.  
b. Reading minutes.  
c. Election of pledges for membership.  
d. Election of pledges proposed.  
e. Proposals for pledgship.  
f. Reports of committees.  
g. Unfinished business.  
h. New business.  
i. Adjournment.

Article II.

Motions.

- Section 1. In all cases not otherwise provided for,  
the fraternity shall be governed by Robert's  
Rules of Order.

Article III.

Regulations.

- Section 1. Any member being absent at roll call shall  
be fined fifty (50) cents for each offense  
unless a reasonable excuse is given.
- Section 2. Any member more than ten minutes late to a

meeting shall be fined fifty (50) cents unless a reasonable excuse is given.

Section 3. The fraternity as a whole shall decide on the validity of any excuse presented in accordance with Sections 1 and 2.

Section 4. Any member failing to perform the duty assigned to him shall be called upon to give reasons for his failure and shall be dealt with accordingly.

Section 5. Any member being absent from three consecutive regular meetings shall be suspended from the fraternity unless a valid excuse is presented.

Section 6. Any suspended member may be reinstated by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the chapter and by payment of all fines for absences.

#### Article IV.

##### Meetings.

Section 1. The regular meetings of the fraternity shall be held once every two weeks.

Section 2. Special meetings may be called at any time by the president of the fraternity.

## Article V.

### Dues.

Section 1. The dues of the fraternity shall be one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) per semester.

Section 2. The initiation fee for each member shall be two dollars (\$2.00) to be paid before the initiation is completed.

## Article VI.

### Miscellaneous.

Section 1. A motion to alter any of these by-laws must be in writing, signed by two members, and remain on the table for one week before a vote is taken on it.

Section 2. Any by-law may be suspended for one evening only, by a two-thirds ( $2/3$ ) vote of the members present

Section 3. Any by-law may be adopted, suspended, amended, or repealed by a two-thirds ( $2/3$ ) vote of the house after it has been on the table for one week.

Section 4. These by-laws shall be in force from and after the time of their adoption.
